



e gets 4000 emails a day from around the world asking about his cosmetic procedures and has famously gone under the knife himself. Beverly Hills cosmetic surgeon Dr Robert Rey, the star of El's addictive reality show Dr 90210, gives O/C the inside scoop on the latest procedures and a sneak peek at what really goes down inside a famous Beverly Hills plastic surgery clinic. The spunky doc – who has become a celebrity himself – can't name his famous clientele due to confidentiality reasons, but has a star-studded waiting list we'd love to get our hands on!

With all this cosmetic surgery and obsession with beauty, do you think society is crazy?

Nothing's changed in 2000 years – we think it's barbaric when certain cultures put rings around their neck like in Africa. In Asia they used to bind girls feet and here I am stuffing silicone balloons inside women's chests. So we're just as crazy!

What is perfect 'beauty' then?

That's a loaded question. There's universal beauty and cultural beauty. Universal beauty is when Cleopatra and Sophia Loren show up and you go, 'Damn who is that?' Cultural beauty is when certain features suit certain cultures – thin lips look better on Caucasians, who have fine features, and thick lips look better on Latinos and Asians.

Do you see any disturbing trends in your industry?

Plastic surgery is like fashion – it changes every year. There's a whole new trend where smart, college-educated girls are coming to LA to be porn stars – as it's been their lifelong dream – and I'm usually the first stop once they get off the bus. They get addicted to surgery. I tell them I've been here for 10 years and seen pom stars turn into prostitutes, but they don't listen. I can't refuse to do surgery on a porn star either because I could be sued.

What's the latest lunchtime procedure in Tinseltown?

Today we have what's called Smartlipo (liposuction). Normal liposuction creates a hole that usually turns brown, and people can see brown holes all over your body. With Smartlipo, we insert through a one-millimetre incision a little laser that liquefies the fat so we can take it out. It also decreases the risk of death – liposuction is one of the big killers in plastic surgery. If one little blob of fat gets into your vessels and makes its way to your lungs, you're going to drop dead the next day – it's called a fat embolism. So we're moving towards less and less invasive surgery.

How do you treat a woman when she comes in for a consultation?

We start by asking questions like, 'How's work?

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How's the family?, which is a way of analysing their mental wellbeing. If we hear Tve had four divorces, I hate my last plastic surgeon. I've had 50 things done,' our eyes glaze over and we very politely show you the door. About 15 per cent of all people who come to see a plastic surgeon have body dysmorphic disorder [severely preoccupied with some aspect of how they look] and about 3 per cent sneak through because they're so used to their disease they know how not to sound psychotic.

I was carrying my knives for surgery! Stage mothers are the worst, because they come in wanting their daughters to look a certain way. But I love the pimps who have a rough, smoker's voice, wads of money and two or three strippers they want me to 'fix'.

What's your personal favourite cosmetic procedure?

I love the sensual part of plastic surgery - lips, noses, breasts.

How many people get rejected?

We have a 90 per cent rejection rate usually from medical conditions such as severe asthma, diabetes,

and severe hepatitis where you could bleed like crazy. We don't want you to die from a boob job and I don't want to kill anyone!

Any funny anecdotes in your line of work?

Once I flew to South America to do surgery on a president's daughter and I was frisked by the Secret Service here in the US, because

I try not to upset nature

or piss off religion too much. My goal is to make the patient happy with the least amount of damage. My goal is to retire in Brazil, because I'm Brazilian, and do reconstructive charity work until I die.
